WASHINGTON, D.C. February 24, 2023

Today marks the one year anniversary of Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine. From the beginning of the invasion, NCSEJ has supported Ukraine's independence and territorial integrity.

We stand with the people and government of Ukraine who have shown bravery and resolve in the face of Russia's brutal assault on its country. We support all forms of humanitarian and security assistance to combat the systematic destruction of Ukraine and call on Russian authorities to end the targeting of civilians.

We commend the Biden Administration and Congressional bi-partisan support for leading the Western coalition in support of Ukraine. We praise President Biden's historic visit to Kyiv as a powerful message of the United States' steadfast commitment to Ukraine.

The Jewish community in Ukraine continues its activities with the full support of the State of Israel and international Jewish organizations. We also continue to fight Russian claims of neo-Nazism and anti-Semitism in Ukraine as a justification for their military actions.

NCSEJ will continue to speak out in support of an independent Ukraine, keep the organized American Jewish community informed of the latest developments, and urge the global coalition to continue to provide the material support needed to ensure Ukraine is able to defend itself.
